#### Freegan Diving

Soaring food prices have led to an increasing number of middle-class New Yorkers joining an unusual organization that “dumpster dives” in 1. \_\_\_\_\_ bins for food.

The trash tours form part of a growing movement called “Freegans”, which is rapidly rising in popularity as New Yorkers find it harder and harder to make ends meet.
